Many have asked, "Why *Hello, Dolly?*" My apologies to those who received the more stressed answer of "YOU try picking a show that's appropriate, different from last year, culturally relevant, and realistically doable with our talent, facilities and budget!!" To answer in a more civilized, well-rested manner, after we were denied rights for *five* different musicals, I am so grateful *Hello, Dolly!* rose to the top, allowing us to showcase the brilliant choreography of Page Jenkins and magical skills of Li Dan, our chief costume designer. (But I better stop mentioning people before I go on for three more pages). Truth be told, I could have announced that we were doing *The Little Mermaid 2* and the BNDS theatre nerds would have responded with the utmost enthusiasm. Such enthusiasm in our students has been my fuel, inspiration, and joy.

Every show's journey is marked with its own struggles and miracles, and our miracle this year was the student leaders. We're committed to making this a great show." Thank you all for letting me be a part of your journey. You have certainly been a large part of mine.
